POST-MEETING SURVEY ANALYSIS RESULTS: DIGICULTGAME

(Appendix IV-Survey Questions)

Introduction: This report presents an analysis of responses gathered from a survey conducted among participants of an EU-funded project consortium. The survey aimed to evaluate various aspects of the project, including past experiences, collaboration with Turkish organizations, involvement in the project, transportation challenges, understanding of project objectives, feedback on the first meeting, expectations for future meetings, collaboration and communication among partner organizations, strengths and challenges of the consortium, and overall insights regarding the project and the kick-off meeting.

- **1. Past Experiences:** Most respondents have prior experience with EU-funded projects, with a notable involvement in various Erasmus+ projects. Some respondents have collaborated with organizations based in Turkey, while others expressed their first-time collaboration with Turkish partners.
- **2. Involvement in the Project:** The majority of participants were invited to join the project by the coordinator or coordinating institution. Some respondents highlighted previous research collaborations or invitations from NGOs as the reasons for their involvement.
- **3.** Transportation Challenges: Few participants encountered transportation difficulties, although organizers promptly addressed issues and provided assistance.
- **4.** Understanding of Project Objectives: Overall, participants felt adequately informed about the project and its objectives prior to attending the first meeting.
- **5. Feedback on the First Meeting:** The first meeting received positive feedback, emphasizing its organization, clarity, and productivity. Suggestions for improvement included delegating organizational tasks to external entities and incorporating more interactive elements into future meetings.
- **6. Expectations for Future Meetings:** Suggestions for future meetings included progress updates, discussions on research findings and game development, technological requirements, user testing, marketing strategies, and collaboration opportunities.







- **7.** Collaboration and Communication: Participants generally rated collaboration and communication among partner organizations positively. Suggestions for enhancing communication included streamlining information sharing processes and scheduling regular progress meetings.
- **8. Strengths and Challenges of the Consortium:** Key strengths identified included diverse backgrounds of consortium members, professional attitudes, and commitment to project goals. Potential challenges included logistical issues related to travel arrangements and synchronizing agendas.
- **9. Additional Insights:** Overall, participants expressed satisfaction with the kick-off meeting, highlighting its impeccable organization and productive discussions.

Conclusion:

The analysis of survey responses indicates a strong foundation for collaboration within the EU-funded project consortium. While participants have diverse backgrounds and experiences, there is a shared commitment to project success. Effective communication, proactive planning, and leveraging the strengths of the consortium will be crucial for overcoming potential challenges and achieving project objectives. The positive feedback from the kick-off meeting reflects the dedication of all stakeholders involved, setting a promising trajectory for future endeavors.
